

THAI PARENTAL TIME AND BUDGET FOR THEIR CHILD'S QUALITY. Achara Navachinda.

Thai parental time and budget for their child's quality was studied from 387 parents of students, grade 3 and grade 6 from Demonstration School at Kasetsart University, Bangkok, Thailand in 1996 by questionnaires. The Pearson Product Moment Correlation was the statistical technique for the analysis by SPSSPC⁺ programme.

The finding revealed that child's quality was positively correlated at .01 statistical significant level with total time and total budget given to child's activities by parents. It was also found that child's quality was more highly and positively related to parental times for child's routine activities than special activities, but parental budget for child's special activities was more highly significant related to child's quality than routine activities at .05 statistical significant level.
