Casual and Formal Ornaments of Gaddimen and Women of Kangra Himachal Pradesh, India

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The Gaddi tribe is a nomadic tribe residing in the Himalayan region of Himachal Pradesh. The main occupation of the Gaddis is sheep goat rearing which provides them with wool, meat and milk. The Gaddis have migratory nature and shift from their hilly cold abodes to plain areas. This folk culture gave them a distinct character and identity as a tribe. Every tribe has specific costumes and ornaments that give them distinct identity. The Gaddis mostly wore ornaments of silver, semi precious stones and gold. Ornaments among Gaddis were more popular amongst the women folk than the male members. The Gaddi females had ornaments for every part of body. They wore ornaments on their head, nose, ears, neck, wrist, hands, ankles and toes. Except the nose ornaments, all other ornaments were of silver and semi precious stones. Only nose ornaments of the Gaddi females were of gold. The craze for ornaments was not seen among the Gaddi men folk. The Gaddi males wore only gold ear ornaments and silver buttons and finger rings.
