Costumes of Gaddi Tribal Women and Changes through Three Generations

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The Gaddis reside in the cold regions of Himachal Pradesh. To meet their requirements of woollen clothing in the very cold region, they took sheep - goat rearing as their vocation to get sufficient quantity of wool, meat and milk. As their herds became sufficiently large the Gaddis adopted migratory nature, coming down towards plain areas during severe winter. Consequently, the Gaddi community acquired the material and design of their costumes depending upon the needs of their terrain and migratory life style. Gaddi females normally wore cotton made dress, which was also made of woollen material to be used under winter conditions. They wore ankle length specially designed gown called Luanchari, Dora and Churidar pyjami. A sleeveless vest was also worn under it. Chadru was the head dress of the Gaddi women. The majority of the grandmother generation females still wore their traditional costume. But now due to the change in the occupation of Gaddis, decline in migratory nature, education of children and influence of the other dresses which are comfortable to work at, the women of mother and daughter generation have adopted Salwar, Kammez and Dupatta as their dress. They used their traditional costumes on functions and festive occasions only.
